Clinical and Teaching Experience

Professor Li is one of the founders of the first rehab. center for child cerebral palsy in China in 1987 located in Jiamusi, Heilongjiang Province. She presided over to establish the first child rehab. training base in China in 1994, and the first Rehab. Medical College of Jiamusi University in China in 1999. She engaged in Pediatric rehab. clinical works started in 1983 after 6 years as a pediatrician. Main clinical works including with the rehab. for various developmental disorders, CP, ASD, IDD, nervous system diseases and hereditary diseases, etc. She has been working as a tutor for graduate students since 1993 and has been engaged in the undergraduate education of rehab. therapy since 2001. Her own educational experience is as follows: completed graduation in Harbin Medical University in 1976 and post-graduation in Jiamusi Medical University in 1986, completed study in Institute of Child Health, University of London in 1991-1992, as a visiting scholar of study in Japan in 1994 and in the UK in 2000-2001.

Research Experience

The research direction of professor Li is the pathogenesis, early prevention and intervention of child brain injury, and engaged in clinical and basic research, carried out 40 research projects, including preparation of animal models of brain injury of different kinds of animals with caused by different reasons, explored the early intervention, rehab. training and medication, etc. Clinical studies mainly focus on the early detection and intervention of brain injury, rehab. assessments, the application of ICF-CY, intervention of comorbidities and complications of CP, improvement of rehab. services for disabled children in remote areas and ethnic minority areas in China, etc. For the last 10 years, presided over an epidemiological survey of cerebral palsy in 320,000 children aged 1-6 in 12 provinces in China, find out the incidence, prevalence, types, etiology, prevention and rehab. status, etc. for CP in China. Conducted a multi-unit (12 hospitals) aged 1-12 genetic study of child CP and relatives, to explore the relationship between genotype and clinical phenotype of CP and the etiology of congenital CP. Some TCM treatments were also studied. Organized the compilation <Chinese rehab. guidelines for cerebral palsy>(2015) , which of the current revision (2022) will be published soon. She has edited a series of books and textbooks, such as <Human Development><Practical Pediatric Rehab. Medicine><Practical Pediatric Rehab. Technology of Cerebral Palsy ><Pediatric Rehab.><Guidelines for Rehab. of Common Pediatric Diseases><Pediatric Rehabilitation>, etc. She has published more than 200 academic papers mainly published in different rehab. medicine journals and pediatrics related journals in China.

Academic activities

Professor Li presided over several national academic conferences on pediatric rehab. and rehab. for child Cerebral Palsy, various thematic academic conferences, and continuing education and training courses. She assisted Professor Shuchun Li established the first child rehab. Committee in China as China association of Rehab.

of disabled persons, Rehab. Committee of Child Cerebral Palsy (CARDP-RCCCP) in 1992. She presided over the establishment of Chinese Association of Rehab. Medicine, Pediatric Rehab. Committee (CARM-PRC) in 2004, and established the Pediatric Rehab. Committee of the Rehab. Medicine Branch of Chinese Medical Doctor Association (PRCRMB-CMDA) in 2006. As one of the main presenters hosted the cooperation projects including "China Partner Alliance (CPN)" cooperation project with the United States, the Hong Kong Society for rehabilitation "a Training of Trainers Project" and with Japanese "Professor Shuchun Li hope aid association", etc. The major Academic Positions in China of Professor Li are as follows: Vice President, China Association of Rehab. of Disabled Persons; Chairman, Rehab. Committee of Child CP, CARDP; Honorary Chairman, CARM-PRC; Honorary Chairman, PRCRMB-CMDA; Vice President, Rehab. Medicine Association of Heilongjiang Province.
